**SUBLIME BEAUTY: RAPHAEL'S
"PORTRAIT OF A LADY WITH A UNICORN"**

SAN FRANCISCO JAN. 9-APRIL 10

On loan from Rome's Galleria Borghese, this 16th-century painting by Raphael will make its way to San Francisco's Legion of Honor in early 2016. The portrait, which is thought to have been commissioned as a wedding gift, features a young woman holding a unicorn (a medieval symbol for purity). The exhibit also explores the influence of Leonardo da Vinci's *Mona Lisa* on the Raphael masterpiece. **\$10. Stanford University's Cantor Arts Center presents a collection of Richard Diebenkorn's 29 sketchbooks that have never been shown to the public until now. The late artist called his sketchbooks "portable studios" and they included everything from oil paintings to graphite drawings from his decades-long career, including the time he spent as a student at Stanford in the early 1940s. **Free. During this festival at Monterey's Old Fisherman's Wharf, you can take a ride on a glass-bottomed boat to spot gray whales, catch marine documentaries or watch demonstrations from the Whale Entanglement Team.
